#### **EXTENSION PROGRAMS 2018**

Last year we successfully ran a variety of extension groups where students with a particular skill or interest were given the opportunity once a week to deepen their knowledge in that area. Mrs Eggins covered technology and writing and Mr Taylor took a maths group in Terms 3 & 4. We felt this was a very positive step to extend opportunities to students to develop their gift or talent.

In 2018 we are dedicating more time to these extension groups with three time slots allocated weekly. Mrs Moore will be running the technology group on Tuesday afternoons, Ms. Davison will be running a creative arts group on Wednesdays and Mr Taylor will run a maths group on Thursdays. All extension teachers will work with class teachers to select the students for the groups this term with opportunities for new students in Term 2. Families will be notified if their child is selected for the group and if any extra materials are needed though I don't believe they will need anything more than their beautiful minds at this point!

#### AUSTRALIA DAY AWARDS CEREMONY

We would like to thank the students and families that came along to the Australia Day Awards Ceremony this year which was held at the Community Hall from 8.00am on Friday, 26<sup>th</sup> January. We had seven students nominated for awards with Indiana and Darcy nominated for Youth of the Year, and Gemma, Mitch, Catherine, Blair and Chelsea nominated for Junior Sportsperson of the Year.

This was a very exciting event for us as it was the first time we had our incoming captains speak at the ceremony and the first time we've put nominations in for awards. With encouragement from our local Chamber of Commerce we are looking to include this in our community events calendar each year alongside ANZAC Day, Remembrance Day and the New Year's Day Fireworks.

Congratulations to Mitch and Lily for their first speech of the year they did a fantastic job and were also interviewed for TV. We also congratulate Darcy on receiving his award for Young Citizen of the Year and Chelsea for Junior Sportsperson of the year. All of the students nominated were worthy of the awards and we're incredibly proud that our 2017 Captains received them.

#### PBL (POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING)

We have a brand new Junior PBL team this year — congratulations to Savanah, Isaac (Yr5), Lili, Cali and Bailey! We're sure you are going to enjoy your responsibilities and thrive as young leaders in our school. Peer Groups won't start straight away as there is a training period for the new team but their playground referee roles will start by Week 3.

Peer Clubs are run on alternate (odd) weeks from assemblies. These are an opportunity to not only work on curriculum based activities but to develop a variety of social and emotional skills that benefit our entire student body. These lessons have been designed and developed by the Junior PBL Team and will be run by them with a teacher there to supervise only.



#### **AWARDS**

Don't forget if you have tallied 10 awards please bring them in so we can organise your Gold Awards. For every 10 awards your child is eligible for a Gold Award. Once they have received 50 Awards (5 Gold) they will become an Honour Student.

Once a student has received their 5 Gold Awards, Honour Student certificate and badge they need to collect and submit another 25 awards to receive **Diamond Status**.

Please note that Harrington's Got Talent Awards don't count towards the overall award tally for each level.

#### SCHOOL BANKING

Our School Banking Day is Tuesday. We would like to remind all our families that parents need to fill in the tab in their child's bank book with the details of their deposit so it can be stamped each week.

We now have Banking Bags for each class where students can put their bank books in on Tuesdays. We would like to encourage as many of our students as possible to bank as saving is a great skill to learn.


