# **PURCHASE OF NEW TECHNOLOGY WITH IGA GRANT**

At the end of 2017 Ritchie's IGA provided our school with a grant of \$1,000 that staff have decided to put toward increasing our technology resources. Over the next few weeks we will be purchasing a drone called an Airblock. Airblock is an easy to use modular and programmable aircraft that is able to transform into a drone, hovercraft and more. The Airblock will utilise the skills our students are developing in coding and problem solving.

We will also be purchasing Bluebots for the Yellow room which are similar to the codeable Beebots in the Kinder room. These robots need a little more coding and planning than the Beetbots and will assist our younger students to keep moving forward with their technology skills.

This year our school and the Junior PBL team will be supporting the national *Bullying!* No Way! day on **Thursday 15**<sup>th</sup> **March**. The Junior PBL Team will be meeting over the next week to determine the activities for the day which will be supported by staff in classrooms.

All students will receive a free wristband and will participate in a lot of learning around the issue of bullying prevention and management.

#### **EOI's for Major School Excursions 2018**

We are very aware that excursion are one of the major costs that parents incur each year and we do our best via fundraising to keep the costs down so that all students can participate. The EOI's for the Stage 2 and Stage 3 excursions have been sent home this week to give families a lot of notice regarding costs and organisation. It is very important

to get these back to us so we can finalise numbers for the excursion otherwise we have to make adjustments later on and that can get tricky and costly. We have organised for 40 students in Years 3 and 4 to go away and 35 students in Years 5 and 6. We ask that you get your EOI plus \$50 deposit in ASAP and make regular payments on the overall cost to make it easier to finalise by the end. These excursions are really important not just for what they provide educationally but for the opportunity to bond with peers, build resilience away from family and gain a little more independence each day. I assure you all staff attending are very good at dealing with homesickness and will give your child the highest quality support and attention throughout the whole experience.

# PBL (POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING)

We have a brand new Junior PBL team this year — congratulations to Savanah, Isaac (Yr5), Lili, Cali and Bailey! We're sure you are going to enjoy your responsibilities and thrive as young leaders in our school. Peer Groups won't start straight away as there is a training period for the new team but their playground referee roles will start by Week 3.

Peer Clubs are run on alternate (odd) weeks from assemblies. These are an opportunity to not only work on curriculum based activities but to develop a variety of social and emotional skills that benefit our entire student body. These lessons have been designed and developed by the Junior PBL Team and will be run by them with a teacher there to supervise only.

The NSW Healthy School Canteen Strategy was introduced in 2017. As part of the strategy, sugary drinks are not to be sold in the canteen.

Sugary drinks include: regular soft drinks, flavoured mineral waters, flavoured waters, sports waters, sports drinks, fruit drinks, coconut waters, cordials, slushies and frozen fruit drinks with less than 99% fruit juice. All energy drinks are also included.

Our canteen stocks refreshing everyday drinks for the students and includes water, plain and/or flavoured milk and 99% fruit juice.

#### \$100 VOUCHER FOR CHILDREN'S SPORT AND RECREATION FEES

Parents in NSW are now able to start claiming \$100 towards extra-curricular sport and other physical activity fees thanks to the NSW Government's new **Active Kids** program.

Active Kids will provide a \$100 voucher for parents to put towards sporting fees and registration costs for every school-aged child in NSW.

The health of our children is a priority for me and every parent. I hope this makes a difference in enabling you to enrol your child in the sport or physical activity of your choice.

Families will be able to use the voucher for registration and membership costs, as well as fees for activities such as swimming.

The annual voucher will not be means tested because the NSW Government wants every child from every family to get active and involved in community sport and fitness.

Parents are able to use their voucher to claim up to \$100 per school-child, per calendar year to reduce the cost of sport registration or membership of approved active recreation activities.
