FOOD ALLERGY AWARENESS - ANAPHYLAXIS



At Harrington Public School we have a nut free canteen and a process of very careful management for food intolerances and allergies of our students.

We ask our families to refrain from packing nuts or using nut products such as peanut butter to protect those students in our community with allergies.

ASSEMBLY

STORM MANAGEMENT PROCEDURES

This is just a brief reminder of our Storm Management Procedures. These procedures are put in place to protect everyone and our beautiful heritage listed Norfolk Pines at the front of the school.

If there are events of high wind or storms we will be asking families to collect their students and enter school grounds from the Coode Street gate on the western side of the school to avoid walking under the pine trees. We post notification of this process on Facebook and Skoolbag so parents are aware that we are in a Storm Management Procedure. It worked really well in 2016 and we thank our families for their support.
