MESSAGE FROM LISA

Welcome back from our autumn and Easter break. I'm sure an abundance of chocolate was consumed by all but I can sincerely assure you all staff are back on deck ready to provide your awesome children with high quality teaching and experiences they will never forget.

Over Term 2 each year we have a multicultural world focus in all classrooms which we affectionately refer to as *Around the World in 50 days*. This involves a varied focus in each room dependant on age, syllabus expectation and relevance. We try to challenge the student's understanding of the world around them and assist them to have broader views and appreciation for cultures, foods, geography (both human and physical), history and perspectives. It is a really engaging topic and brings with it a lot of enthusiasm from our students. Keep an eye on Facebook for what's happening in the classroom and we'll invite families in towards the end of the term to take in what their children have learnt.

With autumn comes the cooler weather, though it has been beautiful over the break it will inevitably come! Please be conscious of colds and flu's and other nasty bugs that tend to increase their presence at this time. We fully understand that it is difficult to keep your child home if they are showing signs of being unwell due to work or family arrangements: most of our staff are working parents as well and have the same issues with their own children. Regardless of the difficulty in taking time we ask, very sincerely, on behalf of staff and our other families, that you do take the time if your child is sick. These bugs spread very quickly and often spread through the whole class and teacher then the whole school. We have had students coughing, vomiting or feverish in our sick bay with symptoms that must have been present before they came to school, so please be conscious of the impact it will have on everyone else if you send them when they are unwell. Spreading of germs is not the only concern we have, our students get quite distressed and upset at school when unwell and just want to be at home with their family when they feel that bad.

NAPLAN IN TERM 2

Year 3 and 5 students will be sitting the NAPLAN assessment on **Tuesday 9th**, **Wednesday 10th** and **Thursday 11th May.** This is an external assessment that takes place nation-wide and is used as a point in time reference of how schools and students are performing towards state and national averages.

We ask that limited pressure and focus be put on these assessments to avoid unnecessary nervousness and anxiety for students. The school is confident in all student's learning and that the students will participate to the best of their ability at this time. If you have a major concern about your child sitting the assessment please contact myself via the front office or make an appointment to pop in. Accommodation or withdrawal is available.



MOTHER'S DAY STALL



We will be organising a Mother's Day stall on Friday 12 May to celebrate the wonderful women in the lives of our students. Gifts will

be available for students to purchase for \$3.00 or \$5.00 each. We realised last year that some students were keen to buy more than one gift so there will be more available this year. The stall will be co-ordinated by School Leaders and Junior PBL Team members.

STEM PARENT WORKSHOPS

We will be holding our first parent workshop/get-together in a few weeks to have a look at and experiment with the new technology devices that we have introduced into classrooms, peer clubs, library and Tech Club (Mrs Eggins) this term.

STEM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics and has seen a huge increase in focus over the past few years. Though we have always covered these areas we have introduced a more contemporary process in classes that align to something called *Maker Spaces* where the students are encouraged to get more hands on and use greater problem solving skills, even from Kindergarten.

During the workshops each classroom will be set up with examples of STEM activities and the robotics/coding materials available for each class. The teachers will assist parents to get involved and play with the materials the students are using.

JUMP ROPE FOR HEART

This year Mrs Burrows is co-ordinating Jump Rope for Heart. This is a great and fun opportunity for our students that encourages fitness and Heart Health. We will be holding our Jump-Off on **Friday 19**th **May** from 10.30am.

MULTICULTURAL BANQUET

We are holding our annual Multicultural Banquet on **Thursday 25th May**. This is a little earlier than when we held it previously but felt it may be easier to manage earlier in the term.

This banquet is an opportunity for each class to embrace one country or group of countries and research, prepare and serve foods plus dress up in colours or clothes representative of the culture they have chosen. Each class teacher will send home a note which outlines the country, the colours or type of dress from that country and provide a return slip with a request for \$10 per child to cover the purchasing of food, plates etc. for the children to prepare.

All the prepared food is then placed on a massive sharing table and the whole school gets to taste food from each country and learn a little about each culture.

TERM 2 MULTICULTURAL SPEAKING PERPECTIVES – K-6

This term we have a whole school focus on Public Speaking. Next week all of our students will receive an information booklet explaining what topics each class can choose from and offering some helpful hints. We have the chance this year to expand the opportunities for four students from Year 3-6 to compete at a Small School and at a Zone level.

Multicultural Public Speaking Perspectives is a whole school activity and will be mandatory for all students to participate at a class level. Please be aware that we understand that this will be an intimidating activity for some of our students and they will be supported to have a go in a safe and supportive way. All our staff care about your children and will not push them past their capacity but will nurture and encourage them to have a go. Public Speaking skills are incredibly



important and easier to conquer when younger rather than older as many of you fully appreciate.

SCHOOL FEES ARE NOW DUE

Thank you to all those families who have supported the school and paid their annual school contribution payments. If you haven't yet we ask that you please make payments ASAP. These funds are a crucial part of purchasing school and classrooms supplies. So far we have had 29% of families pay their contributions.

PARENT ONLINE PAYMENTS (POP)

It is now possible for parents to make online payments to the school for amounts owing for students, via a secure payment page hosted by Westpac. Payments can be made using either a Visa or MasterCard credit or debit card, and can be made via computer, tablet or mobile phone. The payment page is accessed from the front page of the school's website by selecting § Make a payment.

Items that can be paid include voluntary school contributions and excursions. Please note that there is a minimum payment of \$10. There is also a category called 'Other'. This is to cover items not covered in the previous headings; 'Other' can be used to make a complete payment of a school invoice.

When you access the \$ Make a Payment you must enter:

- The student's name, and class reference, OR
- The student's name and date of birth

These details are entered each time you make a payment as student information is not held within the payment system.

There is also the option to enter the Student Registration Number (SRN) and invoice number if you are aware of them – these are optional fields.

This is a secure payment system hosted by Westpac to ensure that your credit/debit card details are captured in a secure manner, these details are not passed back to the school.

You have the ability to check and change any details of the payment before it is processed. Receipts can be emailed and/or printed.

Details of the payments are passed daily to the school where they will be receipted against your child's account. As a receipt has been issued from the payment page a receipt will not be issued by the school.

For any enquiries regarding the online payment process please contact the school administration office.
