2017 ANNUAL CALENDAR AND CLASSROOM REQUIREMENTS

Included with this newsletter and the following newsletters in Week 9 & 11 is an outline of events for each term of 2017 and approximate costing. ENROLMENTS FOR 2017

We are finalising decisions about classes and staffing over the next few weeks so it is extremely important we know of any new students coming to Harrington Public School or students planning to leave. We are looking to encourage all our local students to attend Harrington Public School so if we can assist anyone, provide a tour of the school and its facilities please let us know. Please remember that our school will do everything we can to make it a welcoming and family oriented environment for your children. If you have any concerns please let us know so we can work together to improve whatever we need to.

BUSH FIRE LOCK DOWN AND EVACUATION PROCEDURES

As we are well and truly moving into the hotter weather with the increased threat of fires we would like to briefly run through our evacuation and lockdown procedures.

Evacuation

This procedure is the same for any need to evacuate the school. We assemble at the back double gates on Coode Street (near play equipment). At this point we either monitor



the situation or walk the children to the reserve near the Break Wall and will ask parents to pick up children from there. An alert will go out on **Skoolbag** and comment put on **Facebook** to let parents know we have evacuated to that off-site assembly point.

Bushfire Lockdown or Shelter

In extreme circumstances we may need to move into a Lockdown or Shelter situation; these are times when we are notified that we do not have enough time to evacuate. We move all children to the K-2 classrooms which have been built fire proof for sheltering situations and have provisions in place for such circumstances. If we move into a Lockdown/Shelter situation due to bushfires we cannot let the students or staff leave the building, any parents arriving attempting to pick up their children will be brought into the room with us. An alert will go out on **Skoolbag** and comment put on **Facebook** to let parents know we are in Lockdown.

After the fire has passed or has been made safe enough to evacuate by the local Fire Service we will evacuate to the Break Wall and follow the above procedures.

We thank you for the time you have taken to read through the above outline as it is important to keep everyone informed of what will happen in times of an emergency.

VOLUNTEERS MORNING TEA - TOMORROW!

Tomorrow is our annual Volunteers Morning Tea which is our way of saying thank you to the many parents, grandparents and community members that so willingly help us out every year. The morning tea will run from 10:30 -11:30am.

Notes outlining costume requirements etc. will be sent out closer to the time.

We will be holding our Presentation Assembly during the day on **Monday 5 December**. The assembly will be held at Club Harrington from 12:00 - 1:30pm with a special afternoon tea to be held at the school afterwards. PBL: FOCUS FOR THIS TWO WEEK PERIOD

Don't forget if you have tallied 10 awards please bring them in so we organise your Gold Awards. For every 10 awards your child is eligible for they will receive a Gold Award, once they have received 50 Awards (5 Gold) they will become an Honour Student.

UPDATE DETAILS AND NEW APPLICATION FOR BUS TRAVEL IN 2017

As you will be aware the application process for subsidised travel was changed mid - 2016. This is a brief guide for parents/guardians with students starting school, changing school, repeating or transitioning from year 2 to 3 and year 6 to 7 in 2017.

The government web site is set up in such a way that if parents/guardians do not update their student's details by 31st Dec 2016 they will lose all their current details. As a result of this they will then be required to complete a new application for travel on line for 2017 (applicable for all year 2 to 3, year 6 to 7 students as well as any year 12 students that may repeat in 2017).

Please read the following to prevent this from happening. (Note: students can only "Update Details" if they have a current 2016 Bus Pass, otherwise "Apply now for a travel pass").

All year 6 Students currently enrolled at MVAC and Taree Christian College will be required to update details for year 7 in 2017 even if they are remaining at their current school. For students changing schools or address they can also update details

Print application and return to school they will be enrolled in, in 2017 (i.e. Taree High School, St Clares etc.)

Please Note: At this stage to update student details you DO NOT require a Student Id or Opal Card number
