Principal's Report

Holidays: It's been an absolute pleasure over the past few days, listening to students tell me all about their holiday, whether it was quality time at home with the family, going away in the caravan or visiting Stoney Aqua Park! I also know that they are really excited about all the things happening in Term 4 and are ready to settle back into school routine.

School Grounds: As you may have noticed over the past few weeks, there has been some maintenance and new construction going on throughout the school. This has included: a new driveway entrance onto the oval which now allows easy access for vehicles during school functions (please note that there is to be no parking across the driveway entrance at any time to allow for emergency vehicles); repairs and painting of the play equipment, sports shed and front fence and painting of some rooms within the administration building.







Norfolk Pine: Unfortunately over the past six months we have seen a decline in the health of one our heritage listed Norfolk Pine Trees outside the administration building. Last week we had an expert arborist come out to assess the tree's condition. The arborist believes it is most likely due to being struck by lightning during the storm at the beginning of the Easter holidays. We have been advised that the best course of action is to remove the dead/dying branches at the top of the tree. This should result in new growth and the top of our tree and, hopefully, it's presence for many years to come.


PBL Report
