Tell Them From Me Survey – Have Your Say

Over the past week students have completed the student Tell Them From Me Survey, which gives them an opportunity to have their say in how and what they value at school.

In the coming weeks parents/carers will also have the opportunity to complete the Tell Them From Me Survey, which helps to clarify and strengthen the important relationship between parents and school.

How does it work?

The survey is anonymous and can be used either as a one-off survey or over time, with the ability to identify trends within schools and better inform school priorities.

What does it ask?

The parent survey asks parents/carers a range of questions related to the following drivers of student outcomes:

How do parents access the survey?

- Schools will provide parents with a unique URL to log into the survey. •

- Parents can now easily complete the survey on their mobile device and choose from 22 available community languages.




Blue Room has been learning about so many things like weight, time and 3D and 2D shapes.
